


SOUTHEAST & LIMESTONE COAST



1. Walkway Gallery Bordertown

Walkway Gallery Bordertown is a stunning cultural space that has hosted some of Australia's best-known artists including Del Kathryn Barton and Ben Quilty. The program features some of the best exhibitions you will find in regional Australia created by significant and established artists and storytellers. As the birthplace of one of Australia's most colourful prime ministers you will also enjoy the memorabilia on display in the Bob Hawke Gallery and Hawke House is just two minutes' walk away. The

Walkway Gallery is a lovely find just off the Dukes Highway.

2. Wind Dance – Augmented Reality Mural, Kingston SE

Corner of Agnes and Charles Streets, Kingston, Meintangk Country

Open daylight hours

Whilst in the Southeast don't miss a chance to check out a unique public artwork, Wind Dance – it is an augmented reality mural that needs to be seen to be believed. Created in 2020 by South Australian artist Sarah Boese. The work is stunning and one of few augmented reality artworks you can see in Australia. It features flora and fauna significant to the region including the Heron, which is a spiritual totem of the local First Nations people. Visitors can download the "EyeJack" app onto their device (phone or iPad) and use it to see the gorgeous images featured in the artwork, literally come alive!

3. Naracoorte Regional Art Gallery

Naracoorte Art Gallery is the oldest public regional art gallery in South Australia.

Situated in a Georgian residence once owned by a local doctor, the facility houses a permanent collection of over 200 works including significant works by First Nations artists. A changing program including touring exhibitions and group and individual shows from local and regional artists is on offer and there is a permanent history room featuring the history of the house and local artefacts. Nearby you can learn more about the rich agricultural heritage of the region at the Sheep's Back Museum and a visit would not be complete without stopping by the Naracoorte Caves – home to some of Australia's rare mega-fauna fossils.

The Millicent Gallery is situated alongside the local library and over its 30-year history it has developed a strong exhibition program representative of national, state, regional and local artists and artisans. Its annual art prize offers significant prize money and there are regular public programs and artists in residence. Walking down the nearby main street will take you past the town's impressive mural trail and public art in the Domain adjacent to the gallery. The

Millicent Gallery is a great place to visit when in the Southeast and is just a short drive from the Coonawarra wine region.

5. The Riddoch Arts and Cultural Centre

Situated in South Australia's largest regional city, the Riddoch Arts and Cultural Centre boasts four exhibition spaces and hosts locally curated and touring exhibitions of local, state and national significance. It also has a theatre offering a twice daily screenings of "Volcano", an hour-long film exploring the region's geological history. The Riddoch houses an impressive collection of artworks by leading Australian artists including a suite of prints by John Brack and works by the Boandik peoples. After hours, visitors can enjoy an evening lightshow in the adjacent heritage listed Cave Garden/Thugi, featuring the Boandik story of Mah the Cockatoo. The famous and very impressive Blue Lake/Warwar and Umpherston Sinkhole/Balumbul are just a short drive from the Riddoch and the newly developed Railway Lands connects to a walking trail and has native gardens and public art.
