Yarta Purtli Cultural Centre features two gallery spaces, the Barracks and an open space for outdoor events. The gallery was opened in 2008 in beautifully restored heritage buildings once used as a Blacksmith's Shop, Magistrates Library, Court and offices for the Waterworks. The program on offer at Yarta Purtli features a range of local, regional and touring exhibitions, with local First Nations' artworks showcased regularly. Whilst in town, you can also check out the Arid Lands Botanic Gardens – a unique garden with a wide range of native flora and sculptures dotted throughout pathways, looking across to the Flinders Ranges. "Yarta Purtli" is a Nukunu word meaning "Place of the Stars"

First established in 1992, the Port Pirie Regional Art Gallery is situated in the Port Pirie Regional Tourism and Arts Centre, in the shadow of the magnificent Southern Flinders Ranges. It initially exhibited in the old baggage room of the closed passenger railway station but has since grown to be a well-respected A-Class gallery within South Australia. Its diverse program highlights the unique energy and creativity of the mid-north region alongside exhibitions from partner institutions and touring agencies. Nearby, in the City Park on Ellen Street, visitors can enjoy the Gallery's digital exhibition space. Every night, from sunset work from local schools and community groups is displayed alongside commissioned works from renowned projection artists and local creatives.

Exhibitions at the Nautilus change monthly and showcase local and regional artists as well as touring shows of national and international standing. The gallery is situated in a stunning heritage building first built in 1879, which also houses a 500-seat theatre offering regular live shows. Boston Bay is literally across the road from the gallery with a lovely pier, foreshore and public art dotted throughout a busy seaside retail precinct. The Maritime Museum is a short 20-minute walk away, a great place to learn more about the Eyre Peninsula's rich history.
