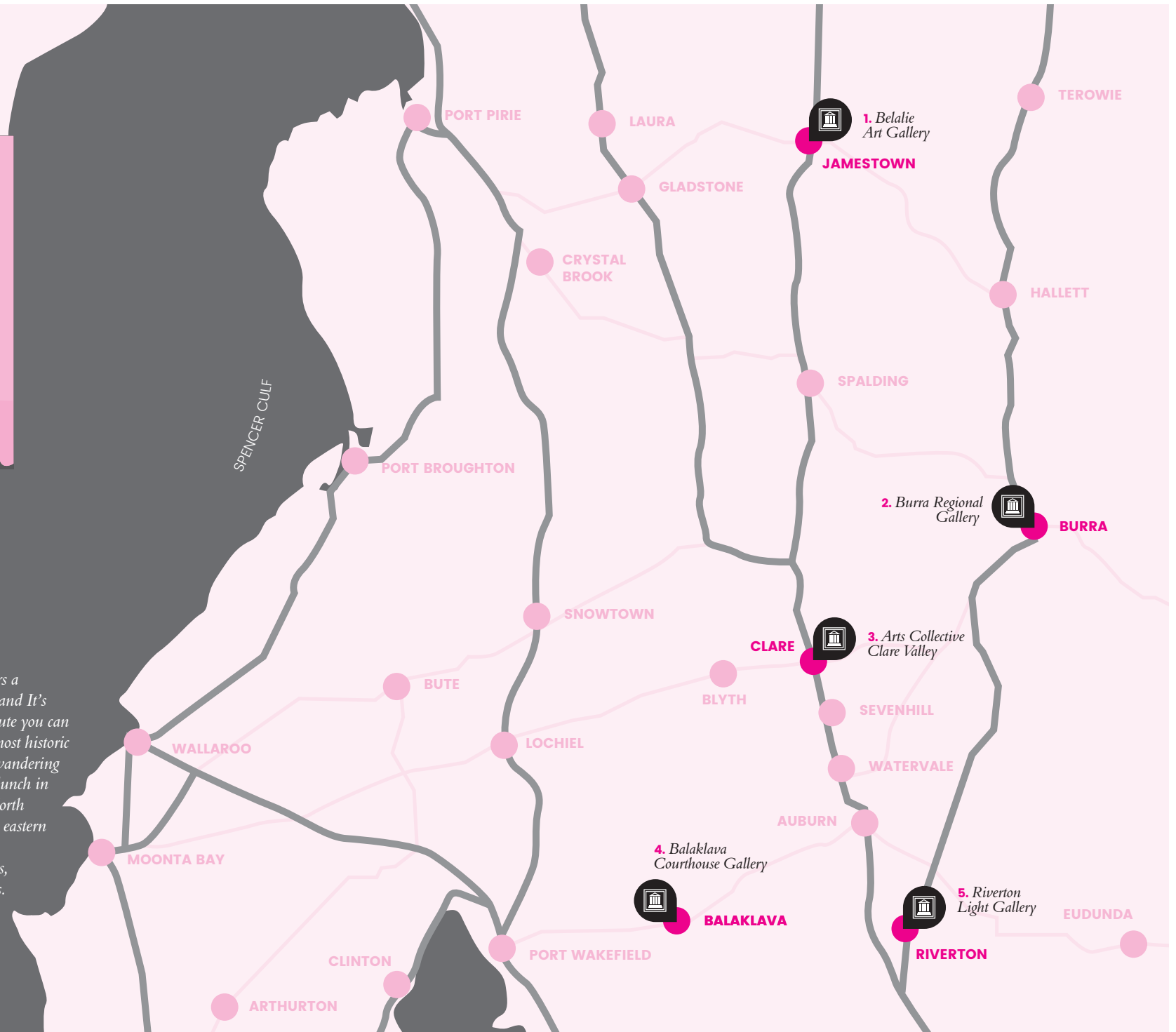


MID NORTH

A stopover in historic Jamestown would not be complete without a visit to the Belalie Art Gallery. The gallery, in a tranquil setting near the Belalie Creek provides versatile spaces for a range of exhibitions during the year. Visitors can also explore other heritage attractions including the National Trust Museum and the Local History Centre and the beautiful Bundaleer Forest is less than 10kms from town.

The 1862 building that houses the Burra Gallery began its life as a telegraph office and was developed by the Regional Council of Goyder as an art gallery in 1996. After taking in the historic architecture, visitors can enjoy high-quality changing exhibitions showcasing the work of local, regional and interstate artists. The Gallery is home to several prestigious collection by well-known artists including Barbara Hanrahan. Burra has many significant historical sites to explore, which alongside the gallery's changing display of arts and craft by local makers offers a great day out.

The Arts Collective Clare Valley is one of the state's most successful artist-run gallery spaces. The collective includes 20+ artists from rural South Australia who work together to show and sell their art in a co-operative run gallery. Tucked away, just off the Clare main street, a quick walk through lovely Ennis Park, which is situated adjacent to the Clare Town Hall. The Gallery offers a selection of ceramics, textiles, mosaics, sculpture, photography, paintings, prints, jewellery and homewares and as an artist run space, visitors can talk directly to the makers who are on hand.
