



FLEURIEU, HILLS & MURRAYLANDS

1. Flinders University Museum of Art

Located south of the city, Flinders University Museum of Art (FUMA) is situated within the University's main campus. It is the custodian of over 8000 Australian and international works spanning the 15th to the 21st centuries, representing one of the largest public collections of art in SA. The public are encouraged to visit and enjoy high-quality exhibitions showcasing works by Australian and international artists.

Sauerbier House is a gorgeous heritage property situated on the edge of the Onkaparinga River. It is a City of Onkaparinga arts initiative supporting contemporary arts and cultural exchange. The galleries present a calendar of diverse

exhibitions, many of which are developed by local and visiting artists. Whilst artists are busy creating work for exhibition, visitors can step inside their studios and interact with artists firsthand. Nearby, visitors can visit the Port Noarlunga Arts Centre and the beach, reef and jetty are 5 minutes' away.

Signal Point Gallery is a must when heading to Goolwa, sitting at the end of the Murray Darling River system where the river meets

the Southern Ocean, part of the Goolwa Wharf precinct. It includes a contemporary art space, alongside a dedicated installation celebrating First Nations culture, the river and the history of the Wharf. The Gallery is in the midst of a major transformation which is part a broader redevelopment of the precinct. Nearby, in the historic police building, the South Coast Regional Art Centre is also worth a visit.

Murray Bridge is an iconic place and a visit to Murray Bridge Regional Gallery is an absolute must! Acclaimed as one of the premier regional galleries in SA, it brings adventurous contemporary arts experiences to the region and showcases local talent from the Murraylands and surrounds. The Gallery offers a diverse program of exhibitions, events and workshops, ranging from seasoned to experimental artforms, from leading artists to recreational makers. It is often the exclusive SA venue for national touring exhibitions and is also a great place to embark on a tour of the town's amazing public art collection. The nearby Round House is also worth a peek, it is one of the region's oldest surviving buildings, now a vibrant community space.

There is a lot to see and do in Hahndorf but no trip to this lovely village would be complete without checking out Hahndorf Academy. It is the second most visited Gallery in SA, and it's not hard to work out why, with the retail space showcasing art, gifts and jewellery by SA artists and makers, three contemporary exhibition spaces and studios. Also situated in the building is the museum, where First Nations and German settler stories are shared. The Cedars, the original home of renowned Australian artist Hans Heysen, is nearby, just a short drive away.

7. Fabrik

Closed temporarily for refurbishment but will reopen early in 2024.

One of the new kids on the block Fabrik is nestled in the main street of Lobethal at the original Onkaparinga Woollen Mill. Initially opening in 2018, it offers exhibitions, workshops and events, but the facility is currently undergoing a major redevelopment and is expected to reopen in early 2024. Passers-by can still get a sense of the stunning industrial architecture and the promise of light filled exhibition spaces, studios and workshops as the new cultural space evolves.
