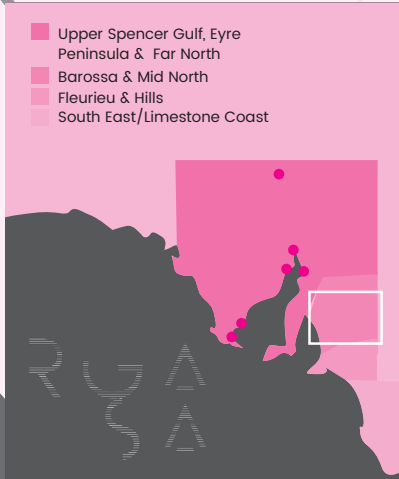
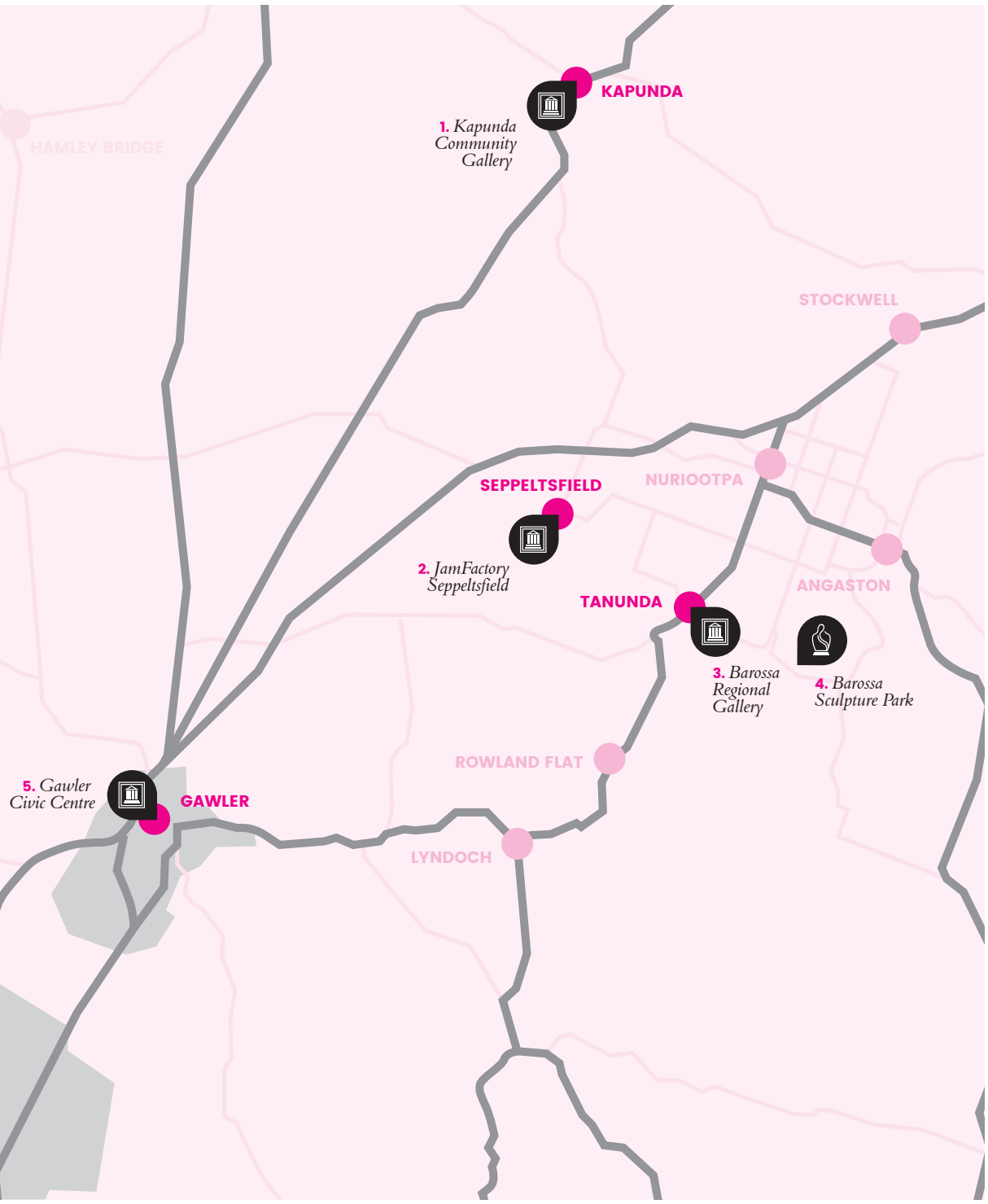


BAROSSA & ADELAIDE PLAINS

Located in a high-profile shopfront on the Kapunda main street, the Kapunda Regional Gallery is easy to find and worth checking out. Exhibitions featuring local and regional based artists and touring content, change over every 6 – 8 weeks and a large array of hand-made artisan wares and locally produced artwork is available for purchase. The Gallery has been a key player in the development of the Kapunda Mural trail which visitors can enjoy as they wander main street. One of the 10+ murals recently won a National Street Art Award.

The Barossa Regional Gallery offers a great program of exhibitions and workshops, and it is also the home of the Hill and Son Grand Organ. The Organ is a unique instrument – one of the largest of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere, restored by a group of passionate volunteers over the last 20 years. Visitors will also find some outstanding work created by local, regional and interstate artists and there is a fantastic gallery store featuring a variety of local and regional artisan wares.
